China's history has been, since prehistory, convulsive and full of infighting and civil wars. Unfortunately, the second half of the 19th and 20th centuries was no different. Nor has China been without controversy in a period when the press, and international interference, have played an active role in the country. However, outside the historiographic realm, few works have decided to treat this century and a half rigorously. This book thus brings clarity to the contemporary history of a country, without whose presence, the current reality of the planet could not be understood. Beginning in the last years of the Qing dynasty, the reader will attend to the end of the monarchy, and to the beginning of the Republic of China, and then make way for the present-day People's Republic of China. The reader will picture its importance in the Korean War, and by extension in the Cold War, and its openness to the global economy. In addition, the emblematic people of each period will be studied, as well as the importance of each period, and the literary and artistic productions of each moment.
